- 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Level      Aerodynamics: Which airplane will fly farther?

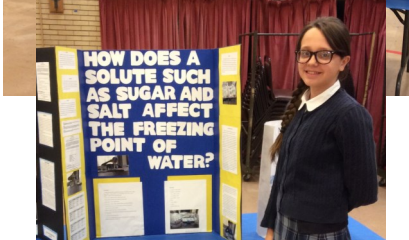
